## Subject: New post-employment activity – Ethics Committee Opinion

Dear Madame President,

On 21 December 2021 the former member of the Governing Council and the Executive Board, Mr Benoît Cœuré, notified the Ethics Committee<sup>1</sup> of his intention to accept the position of President of the French Competition Authority (Autorité de la Concurrence), should his nomination be endorsed by the French National Assembly and the Senate in January 2022.

The Ethics Committee considers that such prospective gainful occupational activity does not raise and could not be perceived to raise conflict of interest concerns given its public sector nature, especially given the absence of overlapping / conflicting responsibilities between Mr Cœuré's former mandate at the ECB and his future responsibilities with the French Competition Authority. Hence, the Ethics Committee is of the view that no cooling-off period would be applicable in such case. In any event, since Mr Cœuré's term with the Executive Board ended on 31 December 2019 any potentially applicable cooling-off period would have already been observed.

For the sake of good order, the Ethics Committee deems it appropriate to remind Mr Cœuré about his duty of professional secrecy applying beyond his term as high-level ECB Official<sup>2</sup>.

In line with the transparency policy adopted by the Governing Council in July 2020<sup>3</sup>, opinions by the Ethics Committee on post-employment matters will, as a rule, be published<sup>4</sup> with a six-month delay.
